Tradition of the Jesse Tree

For Advent 2022, St. John's is reintroducing the tradition of decorating a Jesse tree. The tradition honors the family

history of Jesus and reminds us of the events, men and women chronicled in the Bible before the birth of Jesus. During the time of the prophet Isaiah, the Jewish people were in exile and struggling to live.

As Isaiah prophesied, there is hope in the future because God is good and will care for his people. While a stump isn't a very positive image in itself, knowing that new life will sprout from it is hopeful. **Jesus** is the shoot from the family of Jesse. King David was the son of Jesse and Jesus followed the Davidic line, showing his kingship.

Prayerfully enjoy the beauty of the reflections shared at the beginning of each Mass by our parish families and let that be a part of your advent journey. There are reflections for every day. You don't even need the tree and ornaments to read the daily scripture. A list of daily scripture (and suggested symbols) is on the back of the newsletter.

The tradition of decorating a Jesse tree has been encouraged as a family advent event. As we reflect as a parish family in church, members of a family can gather and read a small reflection remembering the roots of our salvation story.

You can set up a Jesse tree tradition in your home with your own family. Online resources are available to purchase or make the ornaments. (Just Search: Jesse Tree Advent) Or you can look at the suggested symbol and create your own. (I am not that gifted.) It can be as simple or elaborate as you wish.

Just like the Advent Wreath that is a part of our homes at this time, the Jesse tree can bring the real story to life for us all. **Jesus is the reason for the season.**

Jesse Tree Scriptures (The symbols are only suggestions)

December 1 Creation: Gen. 1:1-31; 2:1-4 Symbols: sun, moon, stars, animals, earth

December 2 Adam and Eve: Gen. 2:7-9, 18-24 Symbols: tree, man, woman

**December 3** Fall of Man: Gen. 3:1-7 and 23-24 Symbols: tree, serpent, apple with bite

**December 4** Noah: Gen. 6:5-8, 13-22; 7:17, 23, 24; 8:1, 6-22 Symbols: ark, animals, dove, rainbow

December 5 Abraham: Gen. 12:1-3 Symbols: torch, sword, mountain

December 6 Isaac: Gen. 22:1-14 Symbols: bundle of wood, altar, ram in bush

December 7 Jacob: Gen. 25:1-34; 28:10-15 Symbols: kettle, ladder

December 8 Joseph: Gen. 25:1-34; 28:10-15 Symbols: bucket, well, silver coins, tunic December 9 Moses: Ex. 2:1-10 Symbols: baby in basket, river and vegetation

> December 10 Samuel: 1 Sam. 3:1-18 Symbols: lamp, temple

December 11 Jesse: 1 Sam. 16:1-13 Symbols: crimson robe, shepherd's staff

December 12 David: 1 Sam. 17:12-51 Symbols: slingshot, 6-pointed star

December 13 Solomon: 1 Kings 3:5-14, 16-28 Symbols: scales of justice, temple, two babies and sword

December 14 Joseph: Matt. 1:18-25 Symbols: hammer, saw, chisel, angle

December 15 Mary: Matt. 1:18-25; Luke 1:26-38 Symbols: lily, crown of stars, pierced heart

December 16 John the Baptist: Mark 1:1-8 Symbols: shell with water, river On December 17, the Church begins to intensify the preparation for Christmas with the use of the "O" Antiphons during the Liturgy of the Hours. The symbols for the Jesse Tree from December 17 to 23 are based on the "O" Antiphons.

December 17 Jesus is Wisdom: Sirach (or Ecclesiasticus in old Bibles) 24:2; Wisdom 8:1 Symbols: oil lamp, open book December 18

Jesus is Lord: Ex. 3:2; 20:1 Symbols: burning bush, stone tablets December 19

Jesus is Flower of Jesse: Isaiah 11:1-3 Symbols: flower, plant with flower

December 20 Jesus is Key of David: Isaiah 22:22 Symbols: key, broken chains

December 21 Jesus is the Radiant Dawn: Psalm 19:6-7 (in older Bibles this will be Psalm 18) Symbols: sun rising or high in sky

**December 22** Jesus is King of the Gentiles: Psalm 2:7-8; Ephesians 2:14-20

Symbols: crown, scepter December 23

Jesus is Emmanuel: Isaiah 7:14; 33:22 Symbols: tablets of stone, chalice and host

December 24 Jesus is Light of the World: John 1:1-14 Symbols: candle, flame, sun
