Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Today we begin the journey of Advent and enter into a new liturgical year. In the church, Advent is a preparation period extending over four weeks before the feast of Christmas. Advent comes from the Latin word advenio, which means 'to come to' and refers to the coming of Christ. During this season, we reflect on Christ's historical coming to this world two thousand years ago and His second coming at the end of time. On this first Sunday of Advent, the readings speak of readiness for the coming of Jesus Christ. In the first reading, we hear that God will establish His kingdom, and we must be ready to walk in the light of God. In the second reading, Paul warns us to be awake. In the gospel, Jesus warns us not to be unprepared, as people were in the days of Noah. This is a time to prepare for our Lord to come into our hearts.

Advent has also been known as a "little Lent," as the church invites us to spend more time in prayer, fasting, and good works. For most of us, Advent is a period of hectic activities that often threaten to produce more hassle than delight. Let this advent period be an opportunity for us to focus our thoughts on the gift God has given us in his son Jesus who stepped down from Heaven and took the form of a human being to save us and restore us to God. While preparing our homes and hearts for Christmas, remember that the Lord is among us. And His image is imprinted on all those we meet, the poor who does not have enough, the homeless person who has nowhere to go for Christmas, the prisoner who feels sad and depressed, and the lonely who feels hopeless. Can I see Christ in the people around me, particularly the marginalized? As we light the first candle on our advent wreath, let us be filled with the Hope we have in Christ and resolve to bring Hope to those around us. ~ Fr. Babychan MSFS




